Partners for a Prosperous Athens Physical and Mental Health Subcommittee March 27, 2006

The Physical and Mental Health Committee convened with around 75 participants in the Media Center of Cedar Shoals High School. The group discussed the initial scope of work as determined by the steering committee and potential benchmarks for determining success. One major issue that the group discussed is the need to compile a listing of the various providers and services currently in Athens for the uninsured and the underinsured (i.e. what clinics are available, services offered, location, etc.). A second need is to determine the availability of wellness programs already in existence in industries and businesses in the Athens community. The group expressed a strong interest in seeking models of successful health care programs for the poor, uninsured, and under-insured that currently exist in other communities and examples of wellness programs in other communities. Providing this information to the committee during the next meeting will be important for maintaining momentum.

Another interesting discussion surrounded the Inner-Faith Hospitality Network that exists in the community and the role that it could play in providing basic health care services to the poor of Athens. Through this, and through local churches, medical mission trips to foreign countries are organized and executed. The committee suggested that, while these trips abroad provide a great service to other countries, the need to provide this in our own backyard should also be a priority. Working with these groups to organize a local health fair should be a priority.

Finally, the group had numerous suggestions on other items to be included in the scope of work and that should be looked at as benchmarks for success. Those items follow.
