COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION WORKSHEET

One of the underlying reason why high school students drop our or perform below their capacities is that they lack a sufficiently hopeful and well-informed sense of what kinds of life work they might look ahead to. Such students tend to have little motivation in pursuing their schooling, because they are uncertain and adrift. Accompanying this inadequate understanding of the kinds of challenging and rewarding work that people actually do is a lack of compelling conviction that schooling will play a crucial part in their ability to choose and to pursue successfully a worthwhile vocation.

Take care to make certain the emphasis is on (1) expanding each student's informed sense of the range and variety of the work people do, rather than on a premature narrowing in on the route to a particular "job," and (2) encouraging each student to feel that success is possible, rather than overly-stressing the hurdles that stand in his or her way.
