- 1. Group child care homes can serve up to 18 children.
- 2. Family child care homes can serve up to 6 children for pay.
- 3. **DFCS child care subsidy:** For a family of 2 (single parent and 1 child) their income must be under \$19,392 per year (before taxes, all sources of income). For a family of 4, the income must be below \$29,440/year (before taxes, all sources of income). Fees are based on a sliding scale system based on household income. Single parents have to be working 25 hours per week to be eligible, and in 2 parent families, BOTH parents have to be working 35 hours a week. Parents attending a 4 year college are not eligible. DFCS will help parents if they are in a job training program or working on a GED.
- Average cost of ECLC (licensed Early Care & Learning Center) care for infants per year is approximately \$5,900 (since many centers don't charge for holidays, etc.), which is 20.8% of the Clarke County median family income (for *one* infant). Undergraduate tuition at UGA is \$4,628 per year.
- The average cost per year in Georgia is \$4,878. Only 4 states have a lower yearly cost for center-based infant child care.
- There are 2 full-time and 1 part-time ECLCs that are accredited and 1 ECLC that is state-designated as a Center of Distinction. This may be why the average cost in Clarke County is higher than the state average since accredited and state designated centers must maintain lower child-teacher ratios and may also pay higher salaries. Child Care Resource & Referral is planning to collect data on pay & benefits for child care teachers.
- There are no accredited or state-designated family or group child care homes in Clarke County.
