Attached you will find the complete set of recommendations that has been received from the community so far. You have worked very hard to create these solutions to address poverty in our community and to improve the quality of life for all Athenians. Thank you for your work!

There are over 100 recommendations addressing a variety of issues including Education, Early Learning, Dependent Care, the Economy, Housing, Health, Workforce, Mentoring, Service Providers, Transportation, and Adult Education.

Your participation and recommendations have made several things very clear. First, poverty affects all of us. It reflects negatively on our community and limits economic growth. Poverty makes government, education, health care, and social services more expensive not just for the poor, but for everyone.

As a community we have learned that the issues of poverty are interrelated and must be addressed with a holistic approach. High expectations must be maintained not only of our citizens, but also of our institutions. Business as usual is not working. To break the cycle of poverty we need innovation and creativity.

During the next two months we will continue working with the committee chairs and Steering Committee to research and refine the recommendations. The Steering Committee will agree upon the set of PPA recommendations at its retreat in February. These PPA recommendations will be posted on the web and discussed with you at Town Meetings in March prior to them being sent to the Co-Conveners for their approval. Your continued involvement is critical to ultimate success.

I. List the Learning(s) that this recommendation is addressing:

One of the underlying reason why high school students drop our or perform below their capacities is that they lack a sufficiently hopeful and well-informed sense of what kinds of life work they might look ahead to. Such students tend to have little motivation in pursuing their schooling, because they are uncertain and adrift. Accompanying this inadequate understanding of the kinds of challenging and rewarding work that people actually do is a lack of compelling conviction that schooling will play a crucial part in their ability to choose and to pursue successfully a worthwhile vocation.

Provide ACC students with broader exposure to career and college choices at an earlier (i.e. elementary school) age.

 - a. Offer more off-campus learning opportunities, particularly at the elementary school level (children are more impressionable and investment of limited 'field trip' funds should be made where they can have the biggest impact).
 - b. Change 'career days' to allow for more individualized focus surveying interest in advance to ensure a match between students and professionals; provide opportunities for discussions/demonstrations of selected jobs/careers AND what it takes to get there.
 - c. Seek business and other private underwriting for field trips.

- d. Expand the program currently at the 4 middle schools where businesses come into the schools to discuss what they do and what is needed to be part of that business.
- e. Encourage earlier researching of options and opportunities.
- f. Take care to make certain the emphasis is on (1) expanding each student's informed sense of the range and variety of the work people do, rather than on a premature narrowing in on the route to a particular "job," and (2) encouraging each student to feel that success is possible, rather than overly-stressing the hurdles that stand in his or her way.

 - Match a student and a 'mentor' solely for the purpose of helping the student find and apply for scholarships and financial aid.

- d. Create a uniform scholarship application for all county/local scholarships students complete this and select the ones they want to apply for (similar to Washington County, Mississippi program).
